




Here you'll learn the basics to get started with the Kings Sprayers 50 Gallon Skid Sprayer.



Great for tree-spraying, this model can be used in truck beds, utility vehicles, boats and trailers.

Kings Sprayers manufactures a complete line quality professional sprayers, right here in the USA. This 50 Gallon Skid Sprayer (model #: KS50P5) can be customized to your needs, with everything from swapping out the pump to adding spray booms, among others. Now that you've had a moment to review the instructional video that brought you to this guide, follow these steps to get started with your 50 Gallon Skid Sprayer:

Starting your sprayer for the first time:

1. Ensure all unnecessary personnel are clear of the area.
2. For initial testing, it is recommended to start with clean water instead of chemicals to confirm the system and plumbing components are leak free.
3. Ensure there is fluid in the tank and supply line. DO NOT run dry.
4. Check line strainer for debris or clogs and remove if any are found.
5. Check all plumbing connections to ensure tightness.
6. Ensure all valves and regulators are set to the desired setting and working properly.
7. Ensure all hoses are positioned properly and undamaged.
8. There is no On/Off switch on this model. For a cold start, pull out the choke to full, set the throttle slightly above off and pull start the engine.
9. Then, release the choke by pushing it in fully and raise the throttle to full.
10. Pressure should be adjusted to approximately 150 psi. Note that there will be a drop in pressure when the agitator is turned on.
11. Adjust the spray gun and you're ready to spray.

Shutting down your sprayer:

1. Shut off the sprayer by slowly lowering the throttle to slow.
2. If pump will not be used for several hours flush your system to prolong the life of the components.
